Pastor's Corner



Easter is Here! He is Risen! Risen indeed!

As we share in the joy of Christ's victorious resurrection we have the opportunity to look at how Christ has been active in our lives —how we experience newness through the risen Christ. The early Church experienced Jesus and his resurrection in a myriad of ways: calling their name in the garden of Gethsemane, in the breaking of bread on the road to Emmaus, as a voice in the midst of blinding light on the road to Damascus, at the final gate during an escape from Rome. In all these cases, the people recognized the presence of Jesus, the crucified One, fully alive and present with them.



In the midst of your daily life, do you see or recognize the presence of Christ? Do you see the working of God in experiences that happen in or around you? How have you experienced transformation in your life through the work of God? How does the grace of God in Jesus Christ and the work of the Holy Spirit shape you in your daily life?

As you move throughout your days this Easter Season, I invite you to look around you and see the movement of God and how God leads and guides your through your days. I'm reminded of a Proverb that says, "In their heart one plans their course, but the Lord determines their path." (Proverbs 16:9) King Solomon understood that we find ourselves living in the midst of God's work in our lives and the life of our community and things change in us—unexpected and sometimes unwanted change.

As I look back on my own life there are countless changes in my path that I would never have expected back in High School when I planned to be a physicist studying the properties of light and time. Never in my wildest dreams would I imagine becoming a pastor. That is until God knocked on my door through a friend's sharing of God's grace. How did God bring you here where you are today? More importantly, where do you see God taking you from here?

I'd love to hear your story of God's work in your life. It may be a snapshot of a time in your life that God was particularly present for you; it may be a time when God drastically brought transformation or change, deliverance of forgiveness. How has the work of God in your life made you a different person? I'd love to know.


It's Time to Go Bowling!!!



What Is "Open Arms"???

Several weeks ago, we attended an open house at the Christian non-profit, Open Arms (newly expanded), pregnancy clinic located at Reseda and Plumber. This clinic assists clients facing unexpected pregnancies. The following are no-cost services offered: pregnancy testing, ultrasound, options consultation, pregnancy loss support, education and support on parenting, and help for men. All services are free and confidential.





No insurance or Medi-Cal needed. The medical services are offered by licensed professionals and each patient is treated with dignity and compassion as well as provided with information on all options. This was an informative visit with a "neighbor" just down the street from the church.

Save Gaza

During the Lenten season some of us give up certain food items, by choice, for a period of time and experience temporary hunger. It behooves us as Christians to stop and think of the people where daily starvation is enforced on them, as in the case of the people of Gaza. According to the World Health Organization, people in Gaza are dying of starvation as well as through the continued bombardment of their communities. It may come as a surprise to some that there are Christians in Gaza, as well as in the Holy Land. It is said that Gaza has the oldest church in the world, the Church of Saint Porphyrius in the city of Gaza. It is a Greek Orthodox Church. This church was used as refuge for people during the recent October 7 Israeli attack on Gaza. This church was attacked by the Israeli bombing, and several halls were damaged.



If you are interested or curious to know what life is like under Israeli occupation, you have the opportunity to come and listen to someone who lives there. Snippets of Campus Activity

We Have 22 Very Large Pines on the Property...

...and on a sunny Saturday morning in March, Trees 'N Things, who have been keeping our trees beautiful and healthy for more than 10 years, arrived on the campus to trim them. They came with a team of 15 climbers and ground crew and 2 trucks for hauling the cuttings. Teamwork was clearly the name of the game. With 2 or 3 climbers with chain saws together in a tree at the same time and a ground crew of 2 or 3 more clearing the debris, branches fell steadily and were gathered swiftly and nobody seemed to get in anyone's way.

It was easy to tell where everyone was working because they were all wearing orange jackets. When we asked how many loads of debris would be hauled out, we were told probably 3 loads, since pine cuttings are comparatively

light and fluffy; they compress into the truck bed as more cuttings get piled on top. In about 6 hours our 22 pines were skillfully thinned and the area was cleared. When we shot the group photo at the lunch break, 2 of the guys were still in the trees, so we made sure to get them, too. This was a \$10,000 job

which will probably need to be repeated in about 5 years.

PHILIPPINE MISSION 2024

A 10-person mission team from NUMC went to the Philippines from Feb 1 to Feb 7, 2024 to do outreach work at different mission areas in Nueva Ecija. The team including Pastor Doug Dickson helped in finishing the sanctuary and parsonage for the congregation of Blessed Harvest UMC in the rural village of Pinanggaan, Jaen, a few miles away from our sister church in Lambakin. We also furnished the parsonage with new appliances and furniture. The congregation with its Pastor Lendle Manliclic welcomed the group with a worship service participated in by 30 children. A certificate of appreciation was presented to NUMC.

Pastor Doug was guest preacher at Vesper Service at Wesleyan University-Philippines Chapel attended by its President, teachers, staff and students. Dr. Joseph Lee, NUMC organist, played the piano. A special interpretive dance was performed in sign language by deaf and mute students at SHARE during the service. A dinner reception given by University President Dr. Irineo Alvaro followed the service. A visit to Wesleyan gave us the chance to meet our previous scholars and the two deaf and mute scholars we currently support – Keithleen Guillermo and Ayesha Gevero, as well as their parents and the SHARE teachers. The team toured the SHARE classrooms to see first-hand how the program works for different grade levels.

At the Medical Mission at Lambakin UMC we had a medical doctor, dentist, optometrist and dietician. Glen Dardashti was the dietician who counseled patients on healthy diet lifestyle. Nurses and medical technicians provided mobile blood testing for cholesterol, glucose and uric acid. Results helped the doctor prescribe medicines donated by team members and Eleanor's friend, Flor Ventanilla. Team members brought toothbrushes, toothpaste, first aid kits and over-the-counter medications distributed to patients during the day. Glen's cousin, Dr. Michaela, gave free eye tests and prescriptions for glasses along with free frames. The Medical Mission served over 156 adults and children. The local barangay captain and his council provided tents and chairs and the municipal government of Jaen sent a health center dentist, dental supplies and use of the municipal ambulance on standby.

The group visited two other churches. Soledad UMC in Santa Rosa, Nueva Ecija is in the process of building a new sanctuary around the old one. Eleanor Serrano presented a donation for construction from funds donated by NUMC friends in memory of Bob Serrano. The second church, Christ Above All Methodist Church in San Rafael, Tarlac – is a newly established congregation worshipping in rented space. They plan to build a sanctuary nearby complete, with a Senior Center. Its current pastor is former District Superintendent Rev. Igmedio Equila. He will be guest preacher at NUMC before General Conference in May.

We visited Philippine historical landmarks: the Bamboo Organ in Las Pinas, Metro Manila (Dr. Joseph played the 300-year-old organ); Pangatian Memorial in Cabanatuan City where

American POW's during World War II were rescued by joint forces of US Army and Philippine Underground Forces; and Death March Memorial in Capas, Tarlac where the horrific Death March of American/Filipino POW's from Bataan ended. Eleanor found the name of her father-in-law, Roberto Serrano Sr., on the listing of marchers who survived or perished during the March.

Members of the mission team will report on their experiences during future services. Support of our church for mission trips enables us to be Christ's church outside the US, learning other cultures, establishing friendships and seeing first-hand how our outreach is making an impact to the kingdom of God in these places.
